Dear Parents and Carers,

P6/7 Learning Journey this Half Term

I write with information regarding what the children will be learning about in the main curriculum areas in the coming weeks.

While our class' P.E. lesson is on <u>Wednesdays</u> (for which children need to bring their P.E. kit to take part fully), the school will also be rehearsing for Sports Day when the weather allows. For this reason, *please would you make sure that your child has their P.E. shoes in school every day*. **Swimming** will continue on **Thursdays** for P4, P5 and P7 while P6 will stay in school with me for a 'booster' session.

Here is our homework schedule, as a reminder for your reference. We are drawing closer to revision and examination time; homework will start to reflect that. Please note that the spelling homework has changed: children are to write the spelling words in sentences to show they understand the meanings. Multiple spelling list words may be used in one sentence. Please get in touch if your child would like to join our Seesaw Homework Hub.

Here's what we'll be studying over the next few weeks in the main curriculum areas:

Numeracy:

- Data Handling: including graphs, Carroll and Venn diagrams, databases, mean, median, mode, range and probability covering the topics of length, weight and capacity
- Number: Addition, Subtraction, Multiplication and Division including common and decimal fractions; different methods of multiplying e.g. grid method and long multiplication

- Number: revision of square, prime, cubed (link to volume) and triangular numbers; factors and multiples; the
 four operations in function machines, extending to simple algebra (letter for unknown numbers) and the
 order of operations (BIDMAS)
- Number: negative numbers in relation to temperature
- Number: Roman NumeralsShape: properties of circles
- Problem Solving in all the areas of numeracy
- Revision of all areas of numeracy

Literacy:

- Understanding grammar and spelling rules
- Group reading book with relevant language activities, comprehensions and Thinking File
- Creative writing Using and developing VCOP to create an increasing variety of sentences; varying sentence openers using 'edingly' and/or ISPACE ('ing' word, simile, preposition, adverb, conjunction, 'ed' word) in writing tasks such as recounts, stories, reports (e.g. newspaper), informal writing (e.g. postcards), poetry and persuasive writing.
- Revision of grammar, punctuation and spelling rules and comprehension techniques.

The World Around Us (WAU):

This term our topic is The Titanic: Unsinkable?

- What happened?
- Who was to blame?
- Sorting sinkers investigation
- Titanic-related art

PDMU/UICT

This term we will also be learning about digital citizenship.

In addition, we will be practicing for Sports Day and rehearsing for our school play: *Oliver!* We are delighted with the response so far with regards to requests for costumes and props for the show - many thanks to everyone who has already sent some in.
